### IV. New Business: Uniform Revision Proposal

A. Purpose- to provide a safe and secure environment conducive to learning; Possible benefits include: decrease in violence on campus; elimination of gang-related attire; identification of "outsiders" on campus; reduction of financial burden; reduction of ethnic, social, and economic barriers; development of school pride and unity; enhancement of students' focus on learning; increase in academic achievement

### B. Dress Code regulation

- 1. Tops- students required to wear the HIS uniform on all school days
  - a) Team or Club shirts allowed on Fridays
  - b) Uniform tops cannot reveal midriff

#### 2. Bottoms

- a) Must fit properly at the waist
- b) Must be mid-thigh in length
- c) Can be of any color or pattern as long as no inappropriate graphics/imagery
- d) Must not have rips, cuts, or frays above the knee

### 3. Outerwear

- a) Approved Highlands sweatshirt; must have uniform top under
- b) Full-front (zippered or buttoned) allowed; can be any color or pattern as long as no inappropriate graphics/imagery
- c) Pullover sweatshirts not allowed; hoodies not allowed to be worn

#### 4. Accessories

- a) Caps, hats, visors, beanies, all types of bandanas, dark glasses not allowed
- b) Headphones, earbuds (i.e.-airpods) not allowed, considered contraband
- c) Belts should not be longer than four inches from the buckle; no loose or hanging chains or belts
