7. Dress Code Regulation or Opt-Out Provision

All students of HIS are to wear school uniforms everyday. Parents are recommended to purchase five school uniform shirts from a designated vendor. PE Uniforms must be worn in PE classes.

Gang-related clothing or accessories, which depict drugs, sex, violence, profanity, or clothing otherwise deemed inappropriate, are not allowed. Also, visible markings or tattoos that relate to gangs, drugs, sex, violence, or profanity are not allowed. Fabric prints that suggest activities other than those meant for school are prohibited. Ex. Gambling.

a. Tops

- i. Approved school uniform tops include Highlands Intermediate shirts (short or long sleeve) and Highlands Intermediate sweaters.
- ii. When permitted, optional dress must meet the dress code regulations.
 - a) Shirts should be buttoned at all times. Shirts/tops should not be hanging over more than three inches from the shoulder. No sport jerseys.
 - b) Spaghetti straps, strapless tops, athletic tank tops and undershirts are not allowed. Shoulder straps should be at least one inch wide.

b. Bottoms

- i. Students are allowed to wear their own bottoms which include long pants, shorts, skorts, HIS PE shorts and skirts. All these bottoms must be of any solid color. Materials may be denim, twill, or corduroy. Shorts and pants are not to be saggy or baggy, except for HIS PE shorts. The length of the long pants should not extend more than two inches off the ankles.
- ii. Capris, pedal pushers, flared, boot-cut, and faded pants are allowed. No embellishments are allowed on pants, ex. Lace, sequins. Cut-off pants that have fringes or holes, whether by design or due to wear, are not allowed.
- iii. No short shorts are allowed. To be determined as appropriate in length, the shorts must not be shorter than the tip of the pinkie finger when the arms are extended straight down on the side of the body.
- iv. Girls' skorts and shorts are not to be rolled up at the waist. Slits on skirts may not extend above the knee.
- v. Swimming or board shorts and sweat pants or wind breakers are not allowed. Fleece and nylon bottoms are not allowed. HIS PE shorts and solid-colored jersey shorts are allowed.

c. Jackets

- i. Jackets that have gang-related symbols or markings that depict sex, drugs, profanity, violence, or suggest other activities other than those meant for school are not allowed.
- ii. The uniform should be visible at all times. Other than the approved uniform sweater, pullover jackets or sweatshirts are not allowed. Only jackets with full front openings are allowed.
- iii. Logos on jackets are allowed, but should be appropriate. No sex, drugs, profanity, violence, or gang-related designs.

d. Designs / Accessories

- i. Belts should not be longer than four inches from the buckle.
- ii. Caps, hats, visors, all types of bandanas, elastic headbands and dark glasses are prohibited.

Exceptions to the dress code will be made for medical reasons provided the school receives a note from a licensed physician.

8. Discipline Procedures

Students not in uniforms whether by waiver or due to an optional dress day, must be in compliance with the dress code regulations. Parents of students who are in violation of the regulations will be required to bring an appropriate change of clothing to school as described in Section 7 of the dress code regulations. The student will be sent back to class with a disciplinary notice until the parent arrives with a change of clothing. Students who are referred up to three (3) incidents will perform detention and/or be suspended. The waiver may be voided on the fourth referral.

9. Administrative Authority

As fashions are determined during the school year, the SCC Council has given the administration the authority to determine what can and cannot be worn to school once the SCC Council approves the changes. The administrators will inform the students of the changes through the school bulletin and parents through the PTSA newsletter. Enforcement will be immediate after the students have been informed.

10. Evaluation

The SCC Council will evaluate the School Uniform Policy annually.

SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY (Revised 3/21/2018)

Introduction

The intent of the School Uniform Policy is to provide a safe and secure environment conducive to teaching and learning. It has been determined by the school's SCC Council through shared decision-making that Highlands Intermediate School shall require a school uniform for its students beginning August 1998. The potential benefits of school uniform may include:

- Decrease in violence and theft incidents on campus
- Elimination of gang-related attire
- Identification of "outsiders" on campus
- Reduction of the financial burden on most parents
- Reduction of ethnic, social, and economic barriers
- Development of school pride and unity
- Enhancement of students' focus on learning
- Increase in academic achievement

Statement of Policy

Highlands Intermediate School (HIS) has chosen to adopt a School Uniform Policy. Students attending HIS are required to wear the uniform on all school days, Monday through Friday, with the exception of days to be designated as "optional dress days". Students exempt from the School Uniform Policy must be in compliance with the Dress Code Regulation as stated in Section 7.

Components of the Policy

1. Parental Involvement

The process to develop a School Uniform Policy met all criteria as established by the State of Hawaii BOE. The approval to proceed with the policy was granted by the HIS SCBM Council on January 12, 1998 and was approved by consensus to become effective beginning August 1998. (See BOE Policy 4410 #1; "Schools which wish to establish dress codes (including the adoption of uniform school attire) may do so provided that: 1. Clear evidence is presented that the decision represents the view of the majority of the members of the school community.")

2. Protection of Religious Expression

Highlands Intermediate School shall follow the guidelines as set forth by the HIS School Uniform Policy (1/12/98), the State of Hawaii BOE, and all applicable state and federal laws. (See BOE Policy 4410 #3: "Schools which wish to establish dress codes (including the adoption of uniform school attire) may do so provided that: 3. The Constitutional rights of individuals are respected.")

3. Protection of Other Rights Expression

Highlands Intermediate School shall follow the guidelines as set forth by the HIS School Uniform Policy (1/12/98), the State of Hawaii BOE, and all applicable state and federal laws. (See BOE Policy 4410 #3: "Schools which wish to establish dress codes (including the adoption of uniform school attire) may do so provided that: 3. The Constitutional rights of individuals are respected.")

4. Waiver

Highlands Intermediate School shall follow the guidelines as set forth by the HIS School Uniform Policy (1/12/98), the State of Hawaii BOE, Policy 4410: Dress Code and School Uniforms Policy (11/29/98) and all applicable state and federal laws, except as amended. Parent(s)/guardian(s) and the student wishing to be exempt from the uniform policy must:

- a. Read and understand the HIS School Uniform Policy
- b. Abide by the Dress Code Regulation as described in Section 7 below
- c. Meet with a member of the administration or their representative. Complete and sign the waiver application, witnessed and signed by said administrator or representative.

5. Financial Assistance

Donations of used uniforms will be accepted to help provide uniforms for students needing assistance.

6. Required School Uniform Policy

Students are required to wear the approved school uniform on all instructional days. Students are required to stay in school uniform at all times while on campus.

- a. Approved school uniform tops include Highlands Intermediate shirts (short or long sleeve) and Highlands Intermediate sweaters.
- b. Optional dress days may be permitted at the discretion of the SCC Council or the Principal. When permitted, optional dress must meet the dress code regulations. Request for optional dress day(s) must be submitted by the end of the school year for the following year.
